Collaborative Discourse Management

Dr. Joyce Lloyd, Associate Dean, is leading a taskforce to make recommendations about professional development and policy changes that could lead to improvements in graduate student-advisor relationships. The taskforce recommended implementing the following:

- A graduate student-faculty compact signed by both parties that clearly explain the roles and responsibilities of each individual.
- Development of a conflict resolution and grievance policy for graduate students. A committee will be appointed in 2023 to develop such a policy and to vet it with stakeholders.

General VCU Graduate School Admissions Requirements

The Graduate School has evaluated the graduate admissions requirements of Virginia Tech, UVA, and George Mason University. Through that study, we have found that the general graduate admissions requirements at these institutions are less restrictive than those at VCU. Our suggestion is to review our general admission requirements to see if there are areas of improvement to be in alignment with our peers.

Proof of English Proficiency

Special Actions

The Graduate School is currently evaluating our processes to streamline and reduce the administrative burden. Our first task is to simplify the special action form. We are also evaluating items covered on this form.

VII. Chair's Report

Thank you to the UGC members for providing feedback on the proposed Collaborative Discourse Management, General VCU Graduate School Admissions Requirements, Proof of English Proficiency, and Special Actions items. The Graduate School will circulate materials for a vote from the UGC members regarding General VCU Graduate School Admissions Requirements and Proof of English Proficiency. Before this is done, we will continue to develop the implementation in preparation for a vote.

Collaborative Discourse Management

• Dr. Joyce Lloyd will utilize the feedback to make some adjustments to the compact. At a future UGC meeting, the need for a policy will be discussed.

General VCU Graduate School Admissions Requirements

- The feedback provided from the UGC representatives was in support of removing the letters of
 recommendation and statement of intent requirements from the general admissions requirements of
 the Graduate School. The consensus was that individual programs should decide if and how many
 letters of recommendation are needed for admission into that specific program. Additionally, the UGC
 representatives collectively expressed that individual programs should decide if a statement of intent is
 needed and if so, what should be included. These changes would be in alignment with other peer
 graduate schools in the state.
- A concern is if programs will have adequate time to evaluate their program needs for these requirements under the confines of the bulletin schedule. Dean Gupta has reached out to the Provost Office for guidance on whether a special timeline can be created. This timeline would allow programs to have adequate time to evaluate what is best for them.

Proof of English Proficiency

- The feedback provided from the UGC representatives was that the requirements for satisfying the English proficiency requirements should remain in the Graduate Bulletin. However, these general requirements should align with that of what the Office of Admissions is using so that the information is the same in both places. Additionally, the Office of Admissions should not change their waiver requirements without consulting the Graduate School to maintain continuity for prospective students.
- Dean Gupta has been working with the Office of Admissions and the Global Education Office to update the requirements for waivers of the English Proficiency requirement. The major updates is the addition of several other countries to the list that qualify for a waiver and the reduction of the Duolingo English Test from a minimum of 120 to a minimum of 110 to be in alignment with the TOEL score.

Special Actions

 Dawn Fields Crichlow will be using the feedback gathered to continue to assess the processes and workflow of various special action items. Next week, the Graduate School will be hosting the fall Programs Directors meeting. At this meeting, Dawn will continue to collect feedback from program directors and support staff.
